



Double Degree with the Université de Strasbourg, Faculté de Droit, des Sciences, Politiques et de Gestion, France

Strasbourg is the seat of the Council of Europe and the European Court of Human Rights; thus, studying at the Faculty of Law, Political Science and Management of the University of Strasbourg offers a unique legal-cultural and linguistic diversity.

Number of Study Places:

- 5 study places for the French-language degree programme
- 2 study places for the English-language degree programme

Minimum Requirements:

- Minimum Bachelor average grade of 4.7 **and**
- Completion of the Bachelor of Law degree within 5 years

Special Admission Requirements:

English: Admission to the University of Strasbourg's English-language study program requires proof of proficiency in English (minimum level **C1**).

French: Admission to the French-language study programs requires proof of proficiency in French (minimum level **B2**):

- Diplôme approfondi de langue française (**DALF**).
- Diplôme d'études en langue française (**DELF**).
- Diplôme du test de connaissance du français (**TCF**).

Please note that language certificates must not be older than two years at the time of starting studies at the partner faculty, and therefore not older than one year at the time of applying for the double degree program at RWF UZH.

Tuition Fees at the Université de Strasbourg:

- EUR 370.00 per year (Fees for the academic year 2025/2026, subject to change.)

Duration of Studies:

- 2 Semesters at RWF UZH
- 2 Semesters at Université de Strasbourg

Language:

Courses and examinations at the Université de Strasbourg are held in French and partly in English

Study Programs:

The double degree Master's programmes offered by the RWF UZH can be combined with the following programmes at the University of Strasbourg:

- Master 2 Droit Bancaire et Financier
- Master 2 Droit et politiques de l'Union européenne
- Master 2 Human Rights Law in a Changing World (only combinable with the MLaw UZH in International and Comparative Law)

Degrees:

Master of Law UZH of the Faculty of Law of the University of Zurich (RWF UZH) and Master 2 de la Faculté de Droit de l'Université de Strasbourg.
